1. Describe the structure of Chapter 1 in terms of its **themes** and show why this chapter may be seen as an **introductory summary** of the Book of Isaiah as a whole. [10 marks]

**SECTION D: MEANINGS [20 marks]**

Comment on the significance of the following: / Faamatala le uiga o fuaiupu ia:

1. **3.16-17** The Lord said: Because the daughters of Zion are haughty and walk with outstretched necks, glancing wantonly with their eyes, and mincing along as they go, tinkling with their feet; the Lord with afflict with scabs the heads of the daughters of Zion, and the Lord with lay bare their secret parts.
2. **5.3** O lenei o outou o e nonofo i Ierusalem, atoa ma tagata o luta, ina faamasino mai ia ia te a'u ma la'u tovine.
3. **7.9** The head of Ephraim is Samaria, and the head of Samaria is Re;maliah. If you do not stand firm in faith, you shall not stand at all.
4. **11.8** E taalo foi le tama e lei te'a ma le susu i le lua o le asipi, o le tama foi ua te'a ma le susu, e tuu e ia lona lima i le lua o le gata uogo.
5. **20.6** In that day the inhabitants of this coast land will say, 'See, this is what has happened to those in whom we hoped and to whom we fled for help and deliverance from the king of Assyria! And we, how shall we escape?'
6. **24.21** O lea aso foi e faasala ai le Alii i 'au i lugā i le mea maualuga, atoa ma tupu o le lalolagi i le lalolagi.
7. **44.19** No one considers, nor is there knowledge or discernment to say, "Half of it I burned in the fire; I also baked bread on its coals, I roasted meat and have eaten. Now shall I make the rest of it an abomination? Shall I fall down on a block of wood?"
